# Summer Fire Safety Preparations

#### Emergency events to consider

- Fire
- Grass and scrub fires
- Building fires
- Flood
- Riverine flooding
- > Flash floods
- Storm
- Medical Emergency





#### Fire alarm systems

- Ensure that they have been serviced and all faults rectified
- There are maps of all circuits available at the alarm panel
- Make sure you provide the fire service with keys to the site if you have a fire alarm





#### Preventing Fire Emergencies

- Ensure that any non essential equipment is turned off and if possible unplugged from the power outlets
- Remove all rubbish and waste from the site (especially from the outside of the buildings)
- Clean out all gutters (embers and storms)
- Store all chemicals correctly
- Check all equipment before re-energising
- Have a solid procedure for carrying out hot works (Permits may be required)





#### Site security

- Ensure that the site is secure with all fences in good repair to deter unwanted visitors
- Ensure all gates are securely locked
- External lights are all working
- CCTV systems are operating and warning signs clearly visible
- Security alarms are working and provide the fire services with the instructions on how to isolate/reset them if you have a fire alarm at your premises.
- Consider security patrols





#### Assisting operational crews

- Ensure that all contact details are up to date for:
  - Site security
  - After hours contacts
- Manifests are correct
- Any site specific details
- Ensure that all backup systems are checked and fully functional





#### Flood/Storm emergencies

- Clean all gutters
- Clean all drains
- Remove all waste from outside the building
- Secure loose items outside or move them inside
- Lift important items off the floor





#### Medical Emergencies

- Often critical maintenance is performed
- Limited people on site
- Ensure you know who is working on site and they are inducted as needed
- With low staffing levels people are often using plant they are not familiar with





#### What to do if there is a fire nearby?



#### Walk two streets back!

- Grass fires are unlikely to spread into built up areas
- Access for Emergency services is important
- Roads will be blocked by traffic
- Driving is unsafe as you can't see due to the smoke
- Grass fires are normally short in duration


